Typically, most women stayed at home and 24 did not go to work. 34 When the war started in September 1939, the role of 37 women changed rapidly. 49 With men called up for active service, there was a need for 59 women to undertake the jobs that the men had previously 67 done, giving them the opportunity to become patriotic 76 heroines. During the war, women were employed in a 83 range of positions including: munition factory workers 91 (making weapons); working in the armed forces (army, 102 navy and air force); working as Land Girls; driving buses or 110 trains; working as nurses or ambulance drivers; building 113 ships; becoming searchlight 116 operators and becoming 119 air raid wardens. 124 In 1943, almost 90% of 128 single women and 80% 132 of married women were 134 in employment. $$21,890 \times 1000 = 21,890,000$$

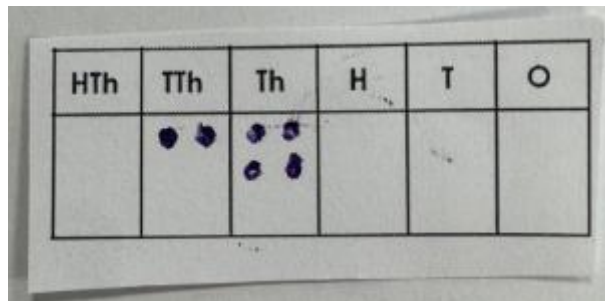
$$736,000 \div 10 = 73,600$$
